## Opening of the Consulate of the Republic of Slovenia in Pittsburgh, PA



**On Thursday, May 15, the ambassador of Slovenia, Dr. Božo Cerar, opened a new Slovenian consulate in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, led by honorary consul, Mrs. Petra Mitchell.**

In his keynote speech, the ambassador underlined three main reasons that drove Slovenia to open the consulate in Pittsburgh:

First, the consulate reaffirms the importance of Slovenia's historic ties with this part of the United States through the Slovenian

community in the region. The vitality of this community is attested by the activities of its organizations in the Pittsburgh and Bethlehem areas among others.

Second, Slovenian business has a strong interest in closer links with one of the economically most dynamic and propulsive parts of the

U.S. In this context, the ambassador emphasized the importance of the Slovenian business delegation of about 15 companies that had met with Pittsburgh-area businesses earlier that day.

Last but not least, in Mrs. Petra Mitchell, Slovenia has found an excellent honorary consul for the region. An

Some 140 invitees attended the opening of the new consulate, including: Congressmen Mike Doyle (14th Congressional District) and Tim Murphy (18th Congressional District); the Mayor of Pittsburgh, Bill Peduto; Allegheny County Executive, Rich Fitzgerald, as well as some of the region's most prominent business leaders, members of the Pittsburgh consular corps and other community leaders.

Both Congressmen and Mayor Peduto expressed positive expectations for the further development of cooperation with Slovenia and were unanimous in their praise of the work and dedicated service of the new honorary consul. Mayor Peduto issued a special proclamation on the occasion of the opening of the consulate.

# Slovenian Trade Mission Visits Ohio and Pennsylvania

In the second week of May, a business delegation of 15 Slovenian companies visited Cleveland, Akron (OH) and Pittsburgh (PA). The mission, consisting of the companies Avbreht & Zajc, Creatoorlabs, Doctrina, D-IMEX, Donar, Fibmarkt, Insol, Kolektor Etra, MZK Elektro, Numip, SMM, Talum, Tecos and TKK Srpenica, was organized in partnership with the American Chamber of Commerce in Slovenia (AmCham Slovenia), public agency Spirit Slovenia, the Embassy of Slovenia in Washington, the Consulate General in Cleveland, and the Slovenian American Business Association (SABA).

In a week-long program, the delegation attended three business forums with B2B sessions and other opportunities for networking with local businesses. It also held meetings with business leaders from the Slovenian

communities in Cleveland and Pittsburgh. The delegation visited the headquarters of two regional industrial giants with operations in Slovenia: Goodyear, and Westinghouse. They were welcomed in the town halls in Cleveland and Akron, and they

also had a chance to witness the opening of the new Slovenian consulate in Pittsburgh.

A number of business-to-business links were established during the mission, and talks on the follow-up activities have already started.

# Minister Erjavec and ICC President Song support the Court's Jurisdiction

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs hosted a two-day international seminar on May 15 and 16 at the Brdo pri Kranju estate, titled "Turning the Kampala Amendments into Reality." The seminar was part of a campaign supporting the exercising of jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court (ICC) over the crime of aggression (<http://crimeofaggression.info/>) and was the first event of its type organized for the countries of the Eastern European Group (EEG). Its purpose is to encourage countries to ratify the changes to the Rome Statute, by which the the ICC will be the first international court since the courts in Nuremberg and Tokyo to be empowered to investigate and convict individuals for the crime of aggression.

The eminent guests, taking part in the discussion included the Slovenian Foreign Minister, Karl Erjavec, the ICC President, Sang-Hyun Song, the U.N. Under-Secretary-General for Legal Affairs, Miguel de Serpa Soares, Slovenian Constitutional Judge and member of the U.N. International Law Commission, Dr. Ernest Petrič, and the President of the Assembly of States Parties to the Rome

Statute, Ambassador Tiina Intelmann. The participants were addressed by U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon via video. The event was organized by the Slovenian Foreign Ministry in cooperation with Liechtenstein and the Global Institute for the Prevention of Aggression.

At the opening, Minister Erjavec underlined the preventive role of the ICC. He said that Slovenia's priorities include respect for human rights, the rule of law, peaceful policies and the prevention of genocide. "We are confident that the ICC can prevent such things, especially the worst human rights violations, genocide and aggression."

The ICC President Song said it is important that the Court

receive the opportunity to judge crimes of aggression, namely, the actions of political or military leaders who are responsible for the worst forms of force used against another country. "Aggression is not a crime in itself, but it often leads to other atrocities, such as war crimes and crimes against humanity. It represents the biggest danger to international peace and security," said Judge Song. He called upon countries to support the ICC in its efforts, and to advocate its universal authority.

The ICC President thanked Slovenia for its long-standing and strong support of the International Criminal Court, and for its contribution to the Trust Fund for Victims.

## Slovenia Has Lost a Good Friend

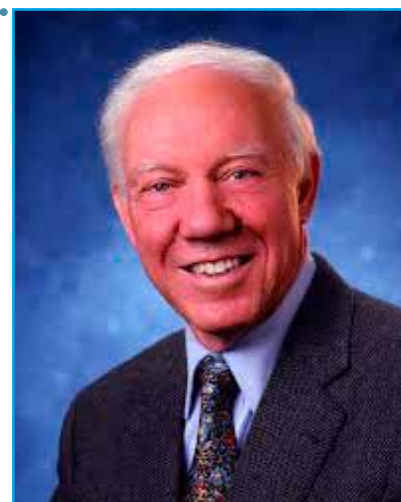
Coverage of the death of a great American patriot, former congressman Jim Oberstar (D-Minn.), captured much of his intelligence and wit and his decades of service to his country ["Minnesota lawmaker was influential in the House," obituaries, May 4]. Not mentioned, however, was that he was a proud Slovenian American who cherished his ethnic heritage.

In 2005, President Janez Drnovsek awarded him Slovenia's highest honor for a foreigner, in recognition of support for Slovenia's leadership in removing land mines from the former Yugoslavia. On that occasion I accompanied Mr. Oberstar to the area near

Ribnica, where his family had come from and where a former Slovenian president, a former prime minister and countless parliamentarians celebrated his Slovenian heritage. In the course of a memorable evening of Slovenian song and dance, and native food and schnapps and wine, Mr. Oberstar chatted in Slovenian with his hosts and led them enthusiastically in many Slovenian folk songs.

The United States and Slovenia have lost a great statesman and a son of the people.

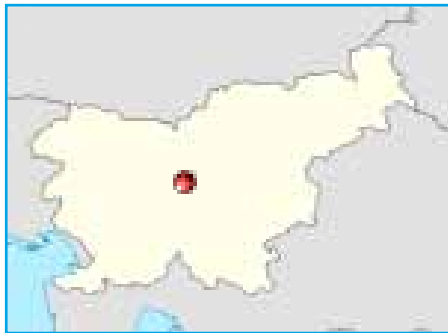

# Ljubljana Celebrates 2000 Years of the Ancient Roman City of Emona



It was in late 14 A.D. or perhaps a year later, that the construction of the Roman colony of Emona (Colonia Iulia Aemona) on the site of the present-day Ljubljana was completed with the help of a large donation from the Roman emperors Augustus and Tiberius. 2000 years later, in 2014, in celebration of the anniversary, the capital of Slovenia is hosting a vibrant program of events, exhibitions, and experiences. Emona, built on a Roman model, was situated on the site of

today's city center of Ljubljana. Governed in accordance with Roman political and religious principles, it was probably inhabited by around 5,000

colonists, whose occupations were agriculture, trade, and crafts. Due to its geographical position the city played an important role in the Roman Empire's system of defense. It flourished from the 1st to the 5th century A.D.

The remains of the ancient Emona, uncovered during the archaeological excavations in the past decades, are today showcased in three archaeological parks and as fragments woven into the city streets. Remains of a residential building with floor heating and well preserved mosaics are on display in the archaeological park the Emona House. The remarkably preserved southern city wall, renovated by the great Slovene architect Jože Plečnik, can be seen in the Mirje area. The remains of

mosaics and a baptismal pool in the archaeological park of the early Christian center near the Cankarjev dom cultural and congress center bear witness to the religious life of the citizens of Emona. Nowadays, a visitor can trace the remains of Emona in modern Ljubljana on special guided tours of Roman Emona by Ljubljana Tourism (May through September 2014). The tours are a truly Roman experience, where the visitors are to put on Roman attire and walk through the remains of Emona accompanied by a Roman legionary and a tour guide dressed as a Roman. Moreover, the evening tours take place in the light of flaming torches!

The main event of the anniversary year, scheduled to take place from August 22 to 24, has been dubbed "Ave, Emona!". Ljubljana's Kongresni trg square and Zvezda park will be occupied by costumed members of historical societies from Slovenia and abroad, who will build a Roman camp and demonstrate what life was like 2000 years

ago as well as a number of ancient Roman skills and arts: from military formations and gladiator fights to dances and cooking. Children will be able to join Roman-themed workshops, a Roman market will be selling handicrafts, and various Roman refreshments will be served at a Roman taberna.

Ljubljana's museums, galleries and outdoor venues will

host a number of Emona-themed exhibitions. The City Museum of Ljubljana will showcase the exhibition "Emona: A City of the Empire" (May 29, 2014 to May 30, 2015), which will shed light on the city's life and heritage. The National Museum of Slovenia's new permanent exhibition "Roman Stories from Where the Worlds Meet" (from July 2014) will bring together

archaeological finds from the time when the territory of the present-day Slovenia was part of the Roman Empire. Cankarjev dom cultural and congress center is hosting the exhibition *Aquae Iasae* (May 21, 2014 to October 26, 2014), which showcases the extraordinary archaeological finds from Varaždinske Toplice in Croatia. From May 28 to September 14, 2014, Ljubljana Castle will host an exhibition on Ljubljana's urban development.

A photographic exhibition, "The Remains of the City", will be mounted in the open air venue along the Jakopič promenade in the Tivoli park in July and August. Ancient ruins are also the theme of the photographic exhibition "Vestiges" by the world renowned photographer

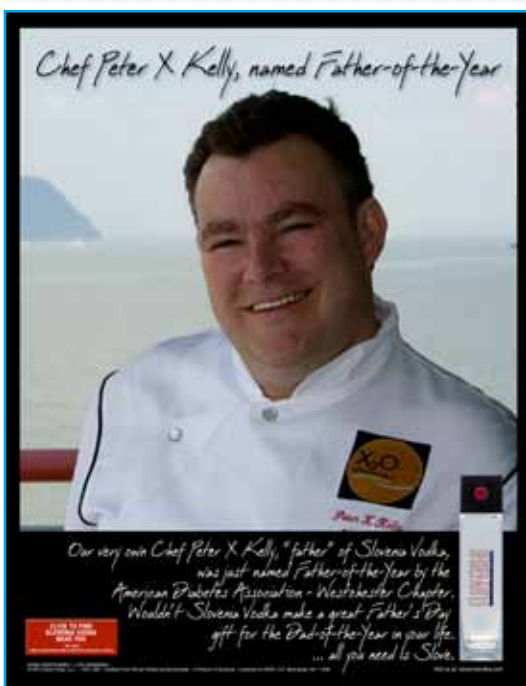
## SLOVENIA VODKA DECLARES INDEPENDENCE FOR FATHER'S DAY

You need to be able to sing or play one of the following instruments: accordion (keyboard, diatonic or chromatic), clarinet, trumpet, guitar, tuba, double bass, bass guitar. This workshop is not for beginners as you will be performing at the famous Avsenik restaurant with other musicians.
